One of our newest members, Nicholas Southwick, is performing a concert this Sunday, January 21st which he has curated with the wonderful poet and Episcopal priest Rita Powell as a part of his role as Liturgy and Music Fellow at the Harvard Episcopal Chaplaincy. The concert, entitled Treasures of Darkness, will be a contemplative evening of music and poetry on the theme of darkness.

They will be playing chants by Medieval mystic Hildegard von Bingen, interludes for solo instruments by Yuko Uebayashi and Caroline Shaw, spiritual melodies by Florence Price, and energized Baroque works by Elisabeth Jacquet de la Guerre, Marin Marais, and Antonio Vivaldi.

Nicholas will be joined by his wonderful colleagues violinist Emma Powell, violist Long Okada (another Redeemer member), cellist Jaime Feldman, and Baroque harpist Phoebe Durand. The music will interact with beautifully evocative poems, many of them read by the poets
