The 2022 Redeemer Christmas Market is now just a month away. As we prepare for this festive annual gathering, we need to remind ourselves that the Redeemer Christmas Market is more than just a fun holiday party where you can wear silly ties and buy Christmas trees. It is, in fact, the time that we gather together with parishioners and neighbors to welcome in the Season of Advent, to demonstrate our resilience and renewed spirit of hope as we slowly emerge from the shadow of COVID and an event where we affirm and express our faith as Christians through gifts of service and philanthropy in support of Mission partners such as Common Cathedral, the Epiphany School and the St. Stephen's Youth Program.

We are pleased to report that this year's Market will feature an in person cocktail party in the Undercroft on Friday evening followed by a catered dinner in the Parish Hall. There will also be a Silent Auction featuring select items from our concessionaires and a few lovely items donated by Parishioners. The evening will conclude with a real LIVE auction. For those who are unable to attend or may have health concerns about live events, we will also be streaming the auction on Zoom, wherein you will be able to bid on items just as if you were in the room with Dan and Mike.

And what ITEMS we have this year! Vacation homes in Maine, New Hampshire and Martha's Vineyard. Sumptuous dinners at the Chandlers and the McNays (with musical accompaniment by the extraordinary virtuoso of the violin, Keila Wakao). Tickets for the Red Sox and the Celtics; four great tickets for Holiday Pops ("on the

first day of Christmas, my true love gave to me....). A "behind the scenes" tour and tickets for Opening Night at the newly-renovated Huntington Theater. And another trip to Fishers Island for the golf nut in the family. The list goes on....

Of course, no Christmas Market would be complete without our beloved concessionaries and your favorites will be back in the Undercroft this year (no tent this year!) selling wonderful chocolates, jewelry, clothing and home ornaments. We will also be selling wreaths made by the members of the Church Service League and lovely balsam fir trees (home delivery, too!) to "spruce" up your home for the holidays.

As a special feature this year, we will be raffling off a brand new satin blue TREK FX+2 Stagger e-bike. During the pandemic, many of us took up bicycling again but discovered that riding up Chestnut Hill and environs was causing more "heartbreak" than we recalled. Not so with a motorized gear in your rear wheel to propel you along the byways of Brookline, Newton and beyond. This ebike retails for \$3,000 but you can buy a chance to own it for \$25 per raffle ticket (or 5 tickets for \$100). That a good return on investment even in this crazy market!

As fun as the market is, we should remember at the end of the day that this Market is truly about loving thy neighbor. When Jesus had to explain "who is my neighbor," he didn't need a PowerPoint to show you the faces of schoolchildren at Beacon of Hope in Uganda, St. Stephen's in the South End or the Epiphany School in Dorchester. Nor the homeless people served by Common Cathedral, the children in the Newton schools whose nutrition we supplement through the FUEL program or the young people gathering together in faith through CRECHE. Yes, the Market is fun but the money that it raises this year,, coupled with the extraordinary volunteer efforts to individual parishioners and our clergy throughout the year, is a tangible express of our love and faith as Christians.

Lastly, we want to acknowledge the support of our beloved clergy and Vestry and all the parishioners who have lent their aid and will be working over the coming weeks to make this the best Christmas Market ever!

Pilgrim Africa Beacon of Hope

While students returned to full-time learning in early 2022, the Uganda government mandated that all boarding students be housed on campus. Responding to the need for a dormitory to house 150 students, the Redeemer community and SMC provided \$43,000 to cover the entire construction. Below is a picture of the dorm near completion.






The 17th hole
