



## FUEL: Groceries for families in need



### **We continue to need groceries and volunteers to pack and deliver!**

The limits on some food purchases make it difficult for us to gather the quantities of food needed. **Currently, we are filling 185 bags with food each week, twice what we were doing in the fall.** Thanks to the continued support of so many of you, we have not had to refuse any requests for food.

Here specifically is what you could donate. Even one or two helps, but sizes are important. While larger sizes may seem more generous and economical, the bags quickly become too heavy for the recipients and for the drivers who lift as many as 40 bags.

- Canned chicken (12.5oz) or tuna (5oz each)
- Bag or can of beans
- Peanut butter (18oz)
- Individual serving cups of fruit or applesauce
- 1 lb. pasta (any type)
- 1 lb. rice
- Box macaroni and cheese
- Cereal (10-12 oz)
- Crackers (10-12 oz), e. g. Wheat Thins/Triscuits
- Marinara sauce (24 oz), preferably in plastic jar
- Hearty soup


